Logline

Drawn together by their love of soccer, a group of disheartened men finds refuge, romance, family and a few surprises...on and off the field!

Synopsis

Discouraged as teenagers by the macho world of sports, a diverse group of transplanted gay men in San Francisco ultimately finds something more encompassing than a place to play soccer: camaraderie, extended family, political refuge and love.

The film unfolds around Jose, a gay asylum refugee from Venezuela; Topher, a middle class Bay Area twenty-something who was bullied and learns to persevere; Jay, a middle-aged Japanese-American from Honolulu who finds love amongst his soccer buds; Brian, a sensitive yet confident artist from small-town Ohio who befriends a Russian teammate and his family; Chris, a once-nervous kid from suburban New Jersey who finds a 'normal' life in San Francisco.

Themes include overcoming fear, the power of community, regaining self-confidence, mentoring, creating family, and of course, soccer!

Filmmaker Bio

With over twenty years experience in the realms of advertising, marketing, consulting, the web, and interactive multimedia, along with an MBA from the Thunderbird School of Global Management in Phoenix, Arizona, Producer/Director Tim Kulikowski left a comfortable, yet unfulfilling, corporate life in 2005 to travel the world and seek out a new path, landing in San Francisco two years later to pursue a lifelong dream of becoming a filmmaker. He believes film is a powerful medium to help bring about social change. Working with the producers of STILL AROUND (premiered at Boston LGBT Film Festival May 2011), a feature compilation of short films about people living and thriving with HIV/AIDS in 2011 (30 years after the crisis began), he co-directed PAWS, one of the 15 shorts, and was an Associate Producer on the overall compilation. BEYOND THE TEAM is his first solo film. While developing new film projects, he is writing a book based on two consecutive years of exploring five continents.

Director's Statement

Hearing Dan Savage and Terry Miller discuss on NPR setting up the *It Gets Better Project* in reaction to a slew of gay teen suicides energized and inspired me to watch numerous videos posted to the *It Gets Better* web site from individuals, companies and organizations—and to create a video of my own. But instead of speaking in front of a webcam by myself, I felt a group of gay athletes, the San Francisco Spikes, with whom I'd been playing for three years, would have more of an impact on struggling teens. The video went live in October 2011 (www.itgetsbetter.org/video/entry/yz4_ooxzbic/ or www.youtube.com/watch?v=20EOLUacu8o). The video has been viewed thousands of times and was used by teammates as a way of coming out to their extended families. Based on positive reaction to the video, along with the encouragement and guidance of friends, the idea of turning the video into a short film, further delving into the personal lives of five players, began to take shape, resulting in BEYOND THE TEAM.

Afraid of team sports at my Minneapolis high school (mine didn't offer soccer), I decided that joining a gay soccer team after moving to a new city was an ideal way to stay active in my 40's, learn a new sport and make friends along the way. Overcoming my tendency towards shyness and fear of team sports took time, but once those faded away I began to *feel the love*. BEYOND THE TEAM captures not only how being a part of the club has affected me, but also shows how a few of its 100+ members feel about being part of a healthy, supportive environment. Soccer is the most popular sport in the world and at a personal level it's had a powerful impact on, and been the connecting factor between, Jay, Chris, Topher, Jose and Brian.

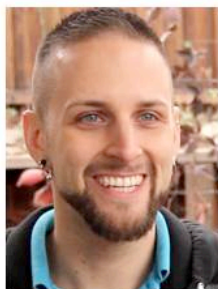

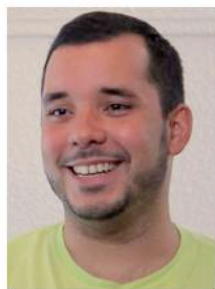

The SF Spikes is a place for gay men to play soccer openly. It currently fields three competitive teams in two different leagues throughout the Bay Area, and has competed in numerous tournaments throughout the world, including the Gay Games and annual IGLFA Tournaments. Its members consist of guys from all across the globe, including those from Argentina, Taiwan, Germany, Japan, Israel, Italy, El Salvador, Holland, Lebanon, Mexico, Ireland and Venezuela.
